

# Southern Village Homeowners Association Manager's Report June 30, 2011

#### **Financials**

May reports are complete & posted on the community website.

### **Work Orders**

Since May 31<sup>st</sup> there were 8 new work orders. Also, 6 work orders were closed.

# **Landscaping**

Ecoscapes has started the irrigation system at the Highgrove Townhouses & Central Park. Several sprinkler heads have been replaced & the system has been checked a second time. The irrigation clock from the Arlen Park entrance has be moved to Central Park. Eight trees were removed from Arlen Park.

Ecoscapes has repaired a large sink hole near the pond at the bottom of Parkside Circle. Trimming & fertilizing of bushes for the Townhouses has begun & will be completed in early July.

## **Website**

Updates continue weekly. As of June 30<sup>th</sup> all documents are current on the website. As a reminder, Berkeley does not charge SVHOA for simply webmaster tasks, such as uploading documents (ex: monthly financials, etc) & the occasional "news" posting (ex: ARB decisions, etc).



### **Central Park**

Weekly trash service has moved from Berkeley to Gregg Melville. Fees are unchanged at \$50 per week (\$200 per month). Gregg is a local (and trusted) vendor that both lives & works in Southern Village.

Southern Village Club summer camps started in mid-June. They are using the park at no charge for the months of June, July & August. All paperwork, including proof of insurance, is complete & on file at the Berkeley office.

## **Alleyway Resurfacing**

All SVHOA owned alleyways will be resurfaced in early July. Here are the steps BPM has taken to assure as smooth a process as possible:

- 1. First letter with a map was mailed on June 1<sup>st</sup>
- 2. Second letter was mailed on June 23<sup>rd</sup>
- 3. To provide more clarity, Peggy drove every alley to determine what addresses would be sealed on what days, that information is at the Berkeley office
- 4. Also, Peggy drove the alleys with Scott, owner of Asphalt Enterprises, to determine if any areas would be difficult to navigate during sealing; Scott pointed out two places which will need attention for HOA landscapers
- 5. King Landscaping was hired to prune back those areas mentioned in #4
- 6. In addition to the second letter mailed, Peggy hand-delivered this same letter to 35 renters affected by the project; also, owners were asked to let their tenants know about the sealing
- 7. Finally, a third letter (or, notice) will be hand delivered to residents the night before the sealing is scheduled for their alleys

In closing, Berkeley cannot stress enough what a huge project this is for SVHOA. We feel strongly we have done everything we can to make sure all goes well.
